3. Future objectives of ITSA

Comments received from attendees:

- Digital Product Passport (DPP) has commonalities, but also differences, with tax stamps and track and trace in terms of unique identifier and security levels – ITSA needs to ensure awareness of this.
- The upcoming DPP white paper from ITSA will assist in creating awareness as well as feed into the drafting of the revised ISO standard for tax stamps.
- Important to get revenue authorities involved in ITSA. This will be done
 through additional online and in-person meetings and associate
 membership. For any in-person sessions, ITSA would consider
 assistance with travel costs.



- ITSA should consider using its monetary reserves to get more 'greenfield' revenue authorities to attend Tax Stamp & Traceability Forum, in partnership with Reconnaissance. 'Greenfield' refers to revenue authorities with no tax stamp or traceability systems in place.
- A simplified ISO standard would be useful as a basis for creating national standards. Could be used in RFPs and any guides to best practice.
