The webinars explored the crucial role of tax stamp and traceability programmes in boosting government finances strained by the pandemic, against the backdrop of the WHO FCTC Protocol and with a focus on key points of ITSA's blueprint for an FCTC-compliant programme.



Some of the webinars were attended by over 100 people, mainly from revenue agencies and ITSA member companies. We have released shortened versions of two of the webinars (one English, one Spanish), which you can view <u>here</u>.

Our intention is to keep the webinar momentum going this year with a series of new themes. One possible theme will revolve around tax stamp best practices and standards, but please let us know if you have ideas for other themes.

Tax Stamp Best Practice Model Project

The Standards working group has been continuing its actions with regard to its newly launched project to create best practice tax stamp models in line with new and evolving ISO standards for securing and authenticating physical documents and creating trusted interoperable systems.

The idea is for interested ITSA members to come together to create physical samples of several types of tax stamps, compliant with relevant ISO standards in terms of functionality, interoperability, security features, applications and related services.
