Since May 2022, we also have a new chairman and new board member.

#### ITSA Launches ISO 22382 Review

The international tax stamp standard, ISO 22382:2018, is due for review in 2023, given that it is general ISO practice to formally review a standard every five years.

The standard was originally published in October 2018, with ITSA's support, as a best practice guidance for tax stamp issuers.

In order to provide input to ISO's review, ITSA has decided to launch its own review ahead of the formal ISO process, with the aim of gathering comments and suggestions from tax stamp issuers and suppliers.

ITSA has asked Ian Lancaster to lead this process. He was ISO's project leader for writing the original standard so is obviously familiar with it, as well as with current trends in tax stamps and ISO procedures.

Together with Ian, ITSA is establishing a a small group of advisers, from mainly revenue authorities and ITSA members, to help ensure that the review is relevant to these key players in the tax stamp field.

We aim to keep the group to a maximum of nine people, and anticipate meetings will take place online, with the possible exception of a face-to-face meeting at the Tax Stamp & Traceability Forum™ in Autumn 2023.

The first meeting will be either before Christmas or in early January, after which we envisage a meeting every couple of months during 2023.

In terms of revenue authorities, the Irish and Kenyan authorities have already confirmed their participation in the advisory group. Should you also wish to become a member of this group, in your capacity as solution provider and ITSA member, please contact **nicola@recon-intl.com**.

In 2023, we will be hiring the services of a part-time social and digital media executive to enhance ITSA's online presence and overall visibility, through social media and other digital channels.

In particular, the executive will help ITSA to:

- Formulate strategies to build a lasting digital connection between ITSA members, potential members, and the markets that ITSA serves.
- Plan and monitor ongoing ITSA presence on social media platforms (LinkedIn, Twitter, Facebook).
- Create content messages, posts, press releases, member communications for all platforms.
- Engage with and encourage members to both create and disseminate social media content.
- Reach out to and create conversations with related social media groups.
- Respond to audience conversations on ITSA and other accounts.

We are currently in discussions with a potential candidate for this important role and will come back with an update on this in the New Year.

## Workshops Are Back!

After several years of little to no travel as a result of COVID-19, it was wonderful to be able to hold in-person workshops again, in 2022, first at the High Security Printing™ conference in Mexico City, and then at the Tax Stamp & Traceability Forum™ (TSTF) in Malta.

ITSA workshops are regularly held in different regions throughout the year (although they only took place online in 2020 and 2021). The workshops typically include case study presentations by tax authorities, technology updates by ITSA members and interactive discussions around a specific theme.

Although many governments in the Latin American region were still hesitant about allowing tax administration members to travel, there was nevertheless a good showing of government authorities at the Mexico event, including delegates from Argentina, Chile, Belize, Colombia, Costa Rica, Guatemala, Panama, the United States and, of course, Mexico.
